

A DESPICABLE ANTI-SEMITIC ACT

On the night of Monday to Tuesday, the Wall of the Righteous, located at the Shoah Memorial in the 4th arrondissement of Paris, was tagged with red hands.

This despicable anti-Semitic act refers to the lynching, immortalized by a photograph that has remained famous, showing a Palestinian, brandishing his bloodied hands following the lynching of two Israeli soldiers murdered and dismembered on October 12, 2000, in Ramallah, by a group of Palestinians.

This vandalism occurred on May 14, the date of the Roundup of the Greenback, in Paris, in 1941, when nearly 6,500 men, aged between 18 and 60, were summoned for "reasons of examination of the situation", before being interned in camps in the Loiret and exterminated for the most part in Auschwitz-Birkenau.

The wall, which is part of the Shoah Memorial, is named after more than 3,900 Righteous who helped save Jews from the Nazi regime during World War II.

The *Union of Jews for Resistance and Mutual Aid* condemns this desecration in the strongest possible terms and vigorously demands that the authorities shed light and condemn the culprits in an exemplary manner.
